Introduction

Shrines are burning, and religious extremism is rising

In the wake of the political upheaval on August 5, 2024, Bangladesh has witnessed an alarming rise in religious violence that extends beyond minority persecution. While Hindu, Christian, Ahmadiyya, and indigenous communities have faced documented violence and repression, widespread attacks have also targeted sacred sites within the majority Muslim community, specifically Sufi shrines, dargahs, and pilgrimage centers deeply rooted in Bengali spiritual and cultural tradition.

These assaults, marked by vandalism, arson, and looting, are seen by many as direct attacks on the fabric of Bengali culture and religious harmony. Analyses of these incidents reveal a disturbing trend: most attacks are perpetrated by hardline religious mobs invoking monotheistic purity, attempting to legitimize their violence in the name of Islam. Despite the growing frequency and scale of these events, the interim government has yet to take substantive action to halt the violence or bring perpetrators to justice.

For centuries, Bangladesh has been a land of religious coexistence, where Muslims, Hindus, Christians, Buddhists, and other faiths have coexisted in mutual respect. The Sufi tradition in particular has played a vital role in shaping the country's spiritual and cultural landscape. However, that long-standing tradition is now under threat.

Since August 2024, attacks on over 100 Sufi shrines and sacred sites have occurred with chilling regularity across the country. In many cases, the attackers, armed with local weapons, have carried out acts of destruction in broad daylight, sometimes even in the presence of law enforcement officers, who have been widely criticized for their inaction.

Such acts of religious desecration are not isolated cases. They reflect a broader campaign to erase the syncretic spiritual identity of Bangladesh. These shrines, often built around the graves of Sufi saints and revered preachers, have long been pilgrimage destinations for people of all backgrounds seeking peace, healing, and divine blessings.

The ongoing attacks are being interpreted by many as part of a deeper cultural assault, an attempt by extremist groups to supplant the country's diverse and tolerant religious traditions with a narrow, militant, and imported ideology. The symbolic destruction of shrines and the simultaneous targeting of markets and cultural spaces suggest a coordinated strategy to impose a more radical socio-religious order.

What is perhaps most troubling is the silence or failure of the state. The lack of decisive action from the interim government has emboldened extremists and left the general public gripped by fear and uncertainty. Many now believe that unless the state decisively intervenes, Bangladesh risks becoming a fertile ground for Taliban-style fanaticism.

In a nation founded on pluralism and cultural resilience, this wave of extremism poses an existential threat. The urgent need of the moment is that civil society, law enforcement, and spiritual leaders must come together to resist the violence before the damage to Bangladesh's soul becomes irreversible.

Shrines vandalized across the country

5 August 2024: Since the fall of the Sheikh Hasina-led Bangladesh Awami League government on 5 August 2024, there have been attacks, looting, and arson on Sufi-influenced Islamic religious sites or shrines of saints and mosques and homes of the Ahmadiyya Muslim community across the country. A radical Islamic group is mainly involved in these attacks.

On Monday, 5 August 2024, many shrines were also attacked and bulldozed. In some places, devotees were publicly humiliated. On this day, the Ashrafnagar Darbar Sharif, established by Syed Ashraf Ali Chandpuri in Laksam, Comilla, was vandalized and set on fire. The first attack was to beat up the shrine's devotees. On the same day, in addition to the attacks and looting of the Kappa Pagla shrine, khanqah houses, caravan houses, and ziarat houses in Narsingdi, the homes of the shrine's keepers and devotees' families were also attacked and looted. Fundamentalists vandalized, looted, and set fire to the shrines of Bairam Shah in Dhaka, Garib Shah in Jessore, Dewan Sharif Khan in Narsingdi, Syed Reza Shah Chishti, also known as Shah Bhala, in Chuadanga, and Malek Darvesh's shrine in Laksam, Comilla (2).

Threats have also been made to burn down the homes of Malek Darvesh's family members. The Dargah Shrine of Palash in Narsingdi, the Bigchan Ali Sureshwari Shrine in Raipura, the Akkel Ali Shah

Shrine in Manohardi, the Hanif Shah Shrine in Manohardi, the Hasen Ali Fakir Shrine, the Rawza Sharif of Khwaja Baba Shah Sufi Abul Hasan Chishti in Khulna, the Waesia Darbar Sharif in Ghior in Manikganj, the Nur Aisa Darbar Sharif in Mymensingh, the Hazrat Shah Badiuzzaman Munshi Shrine in Boalkhali in Chittagong, the Bar Aulia Shrine in Chittagong, and the Ma Jatali Shrine of the Bangla Academy in Dhaka were also attacked on 5 August (29). In addition, the Haider Ali Shah Shrine in Hazaribagh in Dhaka (30), the Akbar Pagla Shrine in Narsingdi, the Alim Shah Chishti Shrine, and the Ayez Pagla Shrine were also attacked on 5 August (31).

In addition to the attack on the shrines, mosques and homes of the Ahmadiyya community were attacked in several places in the country. On this day, the Ahmadiyya mosque, Jamia (theological school), and Jalsa Gah (annual conference ground) were attacked in Ahmadnagar, located in Sadar Upazila of Panchagarh district. About 70 houses of the Ahmadiyya community were attacked. At least 20 people from the Ahmadiyya community were injured in this. Apart from Panchagarh, an Ahmadiyya mosque in Taraganj, Rangpur district, was vandalized and set on fire, and a group of madrasa students attacked a mosque of the Ahmadiyya community in the Madartek area of Dhaka (1).

The shrine of Syed Reza Shah Chishti (Shah Bhalai), located on the banks of the Mathabhanga River in Koshaghata village of Damurhuda upazila of Chuadanga, is 350 years old. On August 5 and 6, 2024, all the structures of this shrine were demolished and razed to the ground. Miscreants looted and embezzled everything from the shrine (25).

6 August 2024: On 6 August 2024, the day after the fall of the Awami League government, numerous shrines and Ahmadiyya mosques were looted, vandalized, and set on fire across Bangladesh. On this day, mosques belonging to the Ahmadiyya community were attacked in Charaikhola Union of Nilphamari district, Bannail of Rajshahi, and Rangtia of Sherpur (1).

The shrine of Shamchu Pagla in Brahmanbaria was attacked for two consecutive days on 6 and 7 August 2024 (2). The attackers hit the shrine's keeper and a local UP member on the head and threw them into a pond, seriously injuring them.

The 300-year-old Darbar Sharif of Hazrat Shah Sufi Meherullah Shah, located on the banks of the Mathabhanga River in Chuadanga district, was also attacked for two days on 6 and 7 August 2024, destroying all the structures there, and even the graves were vandalized. Khadem and devotees have complained that they are being threatened for not going to Darbar Sharif (25).

7 August 2024: On 7 August 2024, extremist fundamentalists attacked the shrine of Hazrat Syed Kalu Shah Abdal (RA) in Jhikira, Ullapara Upazila, Sirajganj district. Along with vandalism, they looted money, various religious items, and furniture from the donation box. After the vandalism and looting, they set fire to it and exploded several bombs.

On 7 August, a group of extremists attacked and demolished the Qutubuddin Shah shrine in Qutubpur Union, Chuadanga district (31).

11 August 2024: On 11 August 2024, the shrine of Hazrat Shah Badiuzzaman Munshi (RA) was set on fire in Kadurkhali, Boalkhali, Chittagong. Locals claim that the shrine was set on fire that morning (32).

16 August 2024: The shrine of Shahjahan Pagla in Poaibari, Dwebidar Upazila, Comilla, was bulldozed on 16 August 2024 (77).

25 August 2024:

The 700-year-old shrine of Aynal Shah was demolished on 25 August 2024. The shrine, located in Khan Bari, Sanamandi Union, Sonargaon Upazila, Narayanganj, was demolished by religious leaders and ulama. During this, a clash between the attackers and the devotees of the shrine arose (33).

29 August 2024:

On 29 August 2024, radical miscreants led by the imam of the mosque vandalized the shrine of Ali Pagla in Mansurnagar Union, Kazipur Upazila, Sirajganj district. The attackers vandalized the shrine and started kicking the grave (22).

3 September 2024: On the afternoon of 3 September 2024, several thousand madrasa students and clerics attacked and vandalized the shrine of Ismail Pagla in Haripur village of Kalia Haripur union of Sirajganj Sadar upazila. Along with the shrine, they also demolished the grave. The attackers looted the donation box of the shrine and looted cash and goods from the shop of the shrine's keeper (21).

6 September 2024: On 6 September 2024, two attacks, vandalism, looting, and arson were carried out at Babe Jannat Dewanbagh Sharif in Madanpur area of Narayanganj Bandar Upazila. 4 people were injured in this (12). Some anti-mazar intruders entered Dewanbagh Sharif and first vandalized the shrine. When some locals resisted, they were beaten up and vandalized various structures before setting them on fire (13).

8 September 2024:

On 8 September 2024, an attack was carried out at Babe Barkat Dewanbagh Sharif in Gopalpur, Amirabari Union, Trishal Upazila, Mymensingh district, with prior announcement on Facebook, ignoring the police and other law enforcement authorities (14). Syed Mehedi Hasan, Coordinator of the Media Cell of Dewanbagh Sharif, told Prothom Alo, ‘Local fundamentalists carried out the attack. 120 of us were injured in brickbats (15).

9 September 2024:

On September 9, 2024, anti-mazar madrasa students and clerics using microphones vandalized, looted, and set fire to the Hazrat Baropir Gausul Azam Darbar Sharif in Sialkol Union of Sirajganj Sadar Upazila. The attackers dug up 3 graves in the shrine and took away the remains. They also looted cash from the donation box of the shrine. Although the incident was reported to the police, the police did not take any immediate action and advised them to file a written complaint (23).

On the same day, an angry mob demolished 8 shrines in Nangalkot Upazila of Comilla. The incident took place in the villages of Hiajora in Hesakhil Union of the upazila and Chhota Fatepur, Tetoia, and Khantachou in Moukra Union of the upazila. The shrines that were demolished on this day are - Yajora Darbar Sharif (Hiajora Tipu Astana), Pir Golam Mohinuddin alias Tipu Astana (Dayal Abul Kashem Shrine), Hiajora Gani Shah Shrine, Raushan Shah (Tetoia) Shrine, Baghmara Dewan Shah Shrine, Fatehpur Petan Shah Shrine, Khantachou village shrine, and Khantachou Shah Jalal Shrine Sharif (34). The attackers vandalized and looted the shrine and set it on fire. In addition, the miscreants vandalized the shrine of Subedar Abdur Rahim, the shrine of Habildar Abul Kashem, the shrine of Abdul Jalil and the graveyard of Nizam Uddin (35). The Udam Shah Shrine, Kerani Sahib's Shrine and Khankay Dewanbagi Shrine in Nangalkot were also attacked (36).

Since the change of state power on August 5, 2024, shrines belonging to Sufi or Tariqa communities across the country were attacked, vandalized, and set on fire. Pak Panjatan Darbar Sharif, Tongi, Gazipur condemned and expressed outrage over the unfortunate incidents (71).

10 September 2024: An 80-year-old shrine in Rupganj, Narayanganj, was demolished by a mob, with prior announcement. The attackers demolished the shrine and mosque with an excavator. Then they set fire to it. About 250 people took part in the demolition of the shrine (37). Law enforcement authorities were silent.

On 10 September 2024, miscreants attacked the shrine of Hazrat Shah Paran (RA) in Sylhet (11) at around 2 am. More than 40 people were injured in the clash that lasted for about 2.30 hours. In addition to beating up the devotees present at the shrine, the attackers vandalized various structures (39).

The shrine of ATS M Khalilur Rahman Al Chishti Nizami in Rajshahi was also attacked on the same day (31). On the same day, miscreants attacked, vandalized, arsonized, and looted the Manchuria Khankah Sharif in the Saraipukur area of Darusar, Rajshahi city (40).

11 September 2024: On the night of September 11, 2024, the shrine and mosque of Alimuddin Chishti were attacked in the Ponabho area of Bhulta Bazar in Rupganj Upazila of Narayanganj (2). The shrine's custodians, imams, and devotees went missing in self-defense.

On the same day, the shrine of Buchai Pagla (RA) in Batulia area of Dhamrai upazila of Dhaka was also attacked and vandalized. According to the locals, activities were conducted in this shrine according to Islamic Sharia. Local mosques and madrasas were run with the money donated by the shrine, and helpless people were helped. Law enforcement agencies arrived after two hours of vandalism. Earlier, the attackers demolished the main building of the shrine with excavators (9).

12 September 2024: On 12 September 2024, the Barkat Maa shrine in the Islampur area of Dhamrai, Dhaka, was vandalized from the evening until late at night. Women mainly came to pray at the shrine (41).

On the other hand, due to the fear of attacks, the Shah Arefin (RA) Astana has been banned from playing songs in Tahirpur, Sunamganj. Regarding the ban on songs, Alam Sabbir, a member of the Astana, said that there have been attacks on shrines and Astanas in different parts of the country recently. There are various conversations in the area about Shah Arefin (RA) Astana. Some are making

provocative speeches. For these reasons, the upazila administration has taken such a decision as a precaution (42).

13 September 2024: On 13 September 2024, the shrine of Shah Sufi Fasih Pagla, located in the Porabari area of Gazipur, was attacked, vandalized, looted, and set on fire by a group of opponents of the shrine, including teachers, students, and imams of various madrasas (7). Due to the vandalism of the shrine, an orphanage run by donations received by the shrine is about to be closed. In addition, when the shrine of Panch Pir in Gazipur was attacked, the attackers clashed with the followers of the shrine, and some were injured (31).

In addition, the shrine of Shah Sufi Chan Mia Fakir was vandalized by fundamentalists in the Nayapara area of Joydebpur Police Station in Gazipur Sadar Upazila (44).

On the same day, a group of 18-20 people vandalized the shrine of Fakir Charu Miji Shah (R.) in Laxminarayanpur area of Noakhali Municipality (20). The shrine is about 250 years old.

On September 13, local miscreants vandalized and set fire to the shrine of Fakir Karim Shah alias Arshed Pagla in Jajira in Shariatpur district and the Majidiya Darbar Sharif shrine (Shalu Shah shrine) in Mokterchar union of Naria upazila. About 250-300 people participated in the attack (24).

In addition, the residence of a poet named Dipankar Saha in Shibchar of Madaripur was vandalized and set on fire. The poet was also injured in this. A group of religious extremists carried out this attack on September 13, 2024 (45).

The shrine of Shah Sufi Abdul Qayyum was demolished by miscreants in the Khadimpara area of Sylhet Sadar. On 13 September 2024, a group of 10-12 people hit the shrine with hammers and demolished it. The graves of the shrine were also broken (43).

14 September 2024: On 14 September 2024, the shrine of Hazrat Shah Rahat Ali (RA) was attacked and vandalized in Chaifullakandi of Bancharampur Upazila of Brahmanbaria (8). The attackers beat and dragged a devotee of the shrine. This terrified the devotees of the shrine.

The office of Chief Adviser Muhammad Yunus has warned that the interim government has "taken a tough stance" to prevent attacks on shrines, religious and cultural installations in various parts of the country.

Recently, there have been incidents of attacks on shrines and dargahs in different parts of the country. In some places, people are gathering and attacking shrines with preparations and announcements.

The government officials have strongly condemned such incidents and have said that strict action will be taken. But there has been no change in the situation. No visible legal action has been taken so far. Law enforcement authorities were silent. In this incident, 46 citizens of the country have condemned the recent attacks and vandalism on various shrines in the country and demanded justice (72).

15 September 2024: A very ancient shrine in Bhawal Mirzapur area of Gazipur district was attacked on 15 September 2024. This shrine, known as the Karamdi Fakir's Shrine, was vandalized and set on fire (31).

16 September 2024: On the day of Eid Miladunnabi, fundamentalists attacked shrine devotees in several places across Bangladesh on 16 September 2024. Hundreds of leaders and activists of Hefazat-e-Islami, Tarakanda Upazila branch, attacked followers of Rezvia Darbar Sharif (Netrokona) with sticks and vandalized several vehicles carrying them at a place called Kodaldhar Bazar in Tarakanda, Mymensingh, where they were celebrating Eid-e-Miladunnabi. At least five people were injured in this incident. Locals said that all the injured were devotees and followers of Rezvia Darbar Sharif (16).

In Kasba Upazila of Brahmanbaria, the procession organized by Ahl-e-Sunnat Wal Jamaat on the occasion of Eid-e-Miladunnabi, like every year, was stopped by Hefazat-e-Islami. Clashes broke out in several places, including Kadamtali in the city, in which about 20 people were injured (17).

In addition, Bangladesh Jamaat-e-Islam and its affiliate organization, Islami Chhatra Shibir, have been accused of attacking a procession celebrating Eid-e-Miladunnabi at the shrine of Hazrat Maizza Huzur (RA) in Daganbhuiya Upazila of Feni district. About 20 people were also injured in this (18).

On the same day, at least 30 people were injured in an attack by the local Imam Ulama Parishad on an Eid-e-Miladunnabi procession in the Chhaysuti area of Kishoreganj district. During this, the Chhaysuti Jame Mosque and the shrine of Syed Abu Mohammad Manjurul Hamid (RA) were vandalized (19). One devotee was killed in this attack.

20 September 2024: The shrine of Qutub Hazrat Donka Shah (RA), located in the Mainar Point alley in the Hossain Bakht Chattar area of Sunamganj Municipality, was attacked. The stairs and donation box of the shrine were broken, and cash was also looted (46).

21 September 2024:

The Rajshahi district branch of Bangladesh Sammilit Sufi Parishad formed a human chain in Rajshahi to highlight the seriousness of recent attacks on shrines across the country, demanding strong measures such as the arrest and punishment of those responsible. The event took place at Sahebbazar Zero Point at 4 pm on 21 September 2025, Saturday, drawing numerous devotees of Sufi saints who demonstrated unity and concern during the hour-long program (87).

28 September 2024:

On 28 September 2024, the shrine of Shah Paran in Dadshi Singa village of Rajbari Sadar Upazila was vandalized. A group of miscreants attacked the shrine at night (31).

29 September 2024: On 29 September 2024, Rashidiya Darbar Sharif in Charasadipur, Kumarkhali, Kushtia was attacked, vandalized, and set on fire. In addition, the Darbar Sharif of Khwaja Shah Sufi Dewan Abdur Rashid Al Chishti Nizami (RA) in Kalahata, Manikganj, and the shrine and house of Sufi saint Kazi Afsar Uddin in Chakulia area of Bangaon Union, Savar were attacked, vandalized, and set on fire on the same day (31).

30 September 2024: Miscreants vandalized and set on fire Lalon Anandadham in Bhanga Upazila of Faridpur. This incident took place on 30 September 2024 in Motra village of Kaulibera Union of the upazila. Several valuable books and journals of Lalon Fakir, as well as various musical instruments, were burned. The statue of Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar was also vandalized. Before the attack, a threat to attack Anandadham was made on social media Facebook on September 12 (47).

In September, 12 incidents of attacks and arson on shrines took place in different parts of the country. At least one person was killed in these incidents. With this information, the human rights organization Manabdhikar Sanskriti Foundation (MSF) said that this is the first time that a shrine has been attacked with prior declaration in Bangladesh. In many places, there have been multiple attacks, and shrines have been demolished with bulldozers, which is an insult to religious sentiments.

The MSF report said that 12 incidents of attacks, vandalism, looting, and arson on shrines took place in Dhaka, Sirajganj, Gazipur, Noakhali, Sylhet, Comilla, Chittagong, Narayanganj, Shariatpur, and several other districts. In these incidents, one person was killed and 43 people were injured. However, people associated with the shrines say that there have been more than 50 attacks on shrines, on small and large scales.

MSF said that no arrests have been reported in the media so far in these incidents. The Manabdhikar Sanskriti Foundation (MSF) believes that a shrine is not just a religious site, but a part of our culture.

In that context, the MSF report expresses hope that the Interim Government will take permanent initiatives to preserve the heritage of the shrine (73).

সেপ্টেম্বর মাসে দেশের বিভিন্ন স্থানে মাজারে হামলা ও অগ্নিসংযোগের ১২টি ঘটনা ঘটেছে। এসব ঘটনায় অন্তত একজন নিহত হন। এ তথ্য দিয়ে মানবাধিকার সংগঠন মানবাধিকার সংস্কৃতি ফাউন্ডেশন (এমএসএফ) বলেছে, বাংলাদেশে এই প্রথম ঘোষণা দিয়ে মাজারে আক্রমণ করা হয়েছে। অনেক জায়গায় একাধিকবার আক্রমণ হয়েছে, বুলডোজার দিয়ে গুঁড়িয়ে দেওয়া হয়েছে মাজারের স্থাপনা; যা ধর্মীয় অনুভূতির প্রতি অবমাননাকর আঘাত।

12 incidents of attacks and arson on shrines in September: MSF

8 October 2024: After completing all the arrangements for the Urs of October 8, 2024, at Bandarkhola in Shibchar, Madaripur, a group of people came and stopped it. Later, on October 23, 2024, permission was obtained from the district administration to organize the Urs again, but it was stopped again due to fear of vandalism (2).

On the same day, the shrine of Shah Mohammad Abdur Rahman Bhandari in Biska village of Tarakanda upazila of Mymensingh district was attacked (31).

18 October 2024: On October 18, 2024, a group of religious fundamentalists declared a ban on singing and playing in a village. This order was issued in Purba Anwarpur village of Balijuri union of Tahirpur upazila of Sunamganj district (48).

29 October 2024: On 29 October 2024, the grave and khanka (shrine) of Aman Pagla were vandalized in Charvelmari village of Nandail upazila of Mymensingh. The attackers also demolished and razed the brick grave of Aman Pagla next to the khanka house (49).

5 November 2024: The shrine of Haji Khwaja Shahbaz (RA) near Suhrawardy Udyan in Dhaka was attacked, vandalized, and the donation box of the shrine was looted on 5 November 2024. Thousands of people, including ulemas of the Islamic Mahasammelan Daawat and Tabligh, Madrasa Qawmia, and Deen Hefazat, who had come to the Suhrawardy Udyan rally, attacked and vandalized

the shrine. At that time, they entered the shrine and beat up the devotees. They entered the shrine wearing shoes and broke the iron railings. They also took away three donation boxes (50).

6 November 2024: In addition to the fundamentalists, the government's law enforcement agencies have also forcibly stopped the activities of the shrine. On 6 November 2024, a group of people came to the shrine of Yusuf Ali Fakir in Narsingdi, the day before the annual 7 November Urs, and forced the organizers to stop the event (2).

22 November 2024: A program called Lalon 'Mahati Sadhusanga and Lalon Mela' has been closed in Narayanganj due to objections from Hefazat-e-Islam. Although it has been held regularly for the past 10 years, this year, despite all the preparations, the district administration did not give permission due to objections from Hefazat-e-Islam. After the fall of the Awami League government, incidents of attacks on shrines, vandalism have increased, and the closure of traditional fairs is also taking place in different parts of the country (81).

A group of fundamentalist extremists demolished the shrine of Belal Pir in Kakua Char Pauli, Tangail. They attacked the shrine on 22 November 2024 (51).

23 November 2024: On 23 November 2024, the Astana of Aminul Haque Pagla was attacked and evicted in Shibpur, Dilapur, Narsingdi (31). The attackers also vandalized and looted.

25 November 2024: During the Sadhusanga meeting, radical fundamentalists attacked the public pilgrimage site in Shyamkura Pardia, Monirampur, Jessore (31). They vandalized and looted there.

26 November 2024: A group of 400-500 people led by a madrasa teacher attacked, vandalized, looted and set fire to the court of Khwaja Badruddoja alias Doja Pir (Murshidpur Pir's Court) in Murshidpur, Sherpur Sadar Upazila. Thirteen people were injured in the clash when they tried to resist the attackers (53).

28 November 2024: A group of extremists carried out a planned attack on the Bayezid Bostami shrine in Chittagong on 28 November 2024. They burned the main gate of the shrine, looted the donation box, and also vandalized the shops nearby (54).

31 December 2024: A group of miscreants vandalized the pandal of the Baul festival organized at the Al Chishti shrine in Lochangar village of Tebaria union of Natore Sadar Upazila. Hossain Kabiraj (55), the president of the shrine committee, said that some villagers had demanded 2 lakh taka as extortion. He alleged that the attack was carried out because the extortion money was not paid.

8 January 2025: On 8 January 2025, an attack was carried out in Mymensingh, disrupting the Milad Mahfil, Doa, and Sama Qawwali ceremonies at the shrine of Hazrat Shah Sufi Syed Kalu Shah (RA). Then, late at night, hundreds of madrasa students attacked again and demolished a part of the 200-year-old shrine (5). Although the shrine, located opposite the Kotwali Model Police Station in Mymensingh Town, was attacked (6), no preventive measures were taken by the police.

10 January 2025: On January 10, 2025, more than a hundred extremists attacked and destroyed the shrine of Maulana Mujibur Rahman in Mirgarh Paschimpara area of Dhakmara Union No. 8 of Panchagarh with spears, hammers, and iron rods (56).

12 January 2025: The administration has closed the 75-year-old Faila Pagla Mela in Tangail Sakhipur. On January 12, 2025, the upazila administration and the joint forces set a 15-minute time limit for traders and visitors to leave the fair. It is worth noting that on January 17, 2003, the banned militant organization Jama'atul Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB) exploded a bomb at this fair, killing 8 people, including the shrine's keeper (57).

On the same day, the upazila administration ordered the closure of the 755th annual Urs of the shrine of Hazrat Shah Syed Abdul Aziz Bogdadi (RA) in Ishwarganj, Mymensingh. It is learnt that the administration ordered the closure of Urs in view of the demand of Ittefaqul Ulama (58).

On the night of January 12, miscreants launched a sudden attack at the Chandraprabha shrine in Rajshahi. The attackers destroyed several graves and memorials. Ten people were seriously injured in the attack (54).

23 January 2025: Religious fundamentalists demolished the shrine of Rasulpur Kheta Shah in Karimpur Union of Narsingdi. It is learnt that on January 23, 2025, a group of people attacked the shrine and vandalized and looted it (59).

On the same day, the shrine of Shukur Ali Shah Fakir in Arjun Nalai village of Gangutia Union in Dhamrai, Dhaka, was also attacked and demolished. Along with the shrine, a house was vandalized, and some parts of the tin fences on both sides of another house were demolished. After this incident, Shukur Ali's two sons left their homes with their wives and children due to insecurity. It is reported that leaders and activists of Dhamrai Ulama Parishad, Imam Parishad, madrasa teachers and students, and some locals were involved in the attack (60).

The World Sufi Organization has claimed that 80 shrines and shrines have been attacked, vandalized, looted, and set on fire in the country in the last 6 months. The leaders of the organization say that a judicial investigation commission should be formed to find out those involved in these incidents and take action.

On January 18, 2025, the press wing of the chief advisor to the interim government reported that 44 attacks had occurred on 40 shrines, Sufi burial grounds, and shrines in the country since August 4. During these attacks, the police have received allegations of vandalism, attacks on devotees, looting of shrine assets, and setting fire. The interim government has adopted a zero-tolerance policy against any attack on shrines. All police units have been instructed to strictly investigate the cases and arrest those involved in the attacks. No visible action has been taken yet.

At a press conference of the World Sufi Organization, the organization's executive member, Hasan Shah Dipu Noori, said, "Even after the press conference of the chief advisor's press wing, there have been attacks on shrines and darbars. Various events have been disrupted. Those concerned are delaying taking legal action in many incidents (74)."

24 January 2025: On 24 January 2025, the shrine of Shah Sufi Hazrat Haqsab Shah (Haq Pagla) in Darinabipur village of Narsingdi district, the shrine of Shah Sufi Hazrat Fazlu Shah in Kalaigobindpur village, the shrine of Mohammad Ali Munshi in Champaknagar village, the residence of Shah Sufi Hazrat Ayub Ali Shah in Srinagar village, and the shrine of Hanif Shah in Khotmora village of Monohardi upazila were attacked and vandalized (31).

30 January 2025: A human chain has been formed in Narsingdi demanding justice for those involved in the attacks, looting, and vandalism on Sufi shrines and akhras. Devotees of various shrines, shrines, and akhras formed the human chain in front of the Narsingdi Press Club on Thursday afternoon, on 30 January 2025.

The Narsingdi District Branch of the World Sufi Organization organized the human chain. More than a hundred devotees of shrines and akhras of six upazilas of Narsingdi district participated in the hour-

long human chain. They strongly condemned and protested these incidents. They demanded that those involved in the attacks on various shrines in Palash, Raipura, Shibpur, and Monohardi of Narsingdi be identified and brought to justice (75).

8 February 2025: A group of miscreants demolished and destroyed the shrine of Jaber Pagla in the Mazukhan area of Mouchak Union of Gazipur. They attacked the shrine on 8 February 2025 and caused extensive vandalism and looting (61).

9 February 2025: On the afternoon of 9 February 2025, the Pir Sahib of Herabon Pak Darbar Sharif in Sreepur, Gazipur, was beaten up and handed over to the police (31). The shrine was also attacked at this time.

12 February 2025: Lalon Sangha has postponed the Lalon Memorial Festival program in Madhupur, Tangail, in the face of resistance from Hefazat-e-Islam and Ulama Parishad Modhupur Branch. The Lalon Memorial Festival was scheduled to be held at Madhupur bus stand at 8 pm on 12 February 2025. The convener of the event celebration committee, Md. Sabuj Mia wrote in a status on social media Facebook that the event could not be held due to the resistance imposed by Hefazat-e-Islam and Ulama Parishad Madhupur branch (62).

12 February 2025: On 17 February 2025, a group of miscreants attacked and vandalized a shrine named Ghasipur Darbar Sharif in Ghasipur village, Noakhali union, Chatkhil upazila, Noakhali district (3). On the same day, the shrine of Madhu Darvesh in Chatkhil was demolished (31).

19 February 2025: The shrine of Syed Muhammad Shayar Muhammad Shah Al Qaderi Al Chishti in Pekua, Cox's Bazar, was attacked and vandalized during the Urs on 19 February 2025 (31).

20 February 2025: Despite prior reports of tense conditions, the shrine and Urs pandal of Shah Sufi Ayub Ali Darvesh in Kaladrap Union of Sadar Upazila of Noakhali district were vandalized on 20 February 2025 in the presence of police and army (3). Several people were also injured in the attack. Two shrines were vandalized in Noakhali within a span of four days.

The same day, the Dargah shrine in Comilla was also attacked and vandalized (54).

21 February 2025: In Singair, Manikganj, an attack led by a local leader of the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) and along with police obstruction, disrupted the annual Urs Mahfil of Baul Emperor Abdur Rashid Boyati at Azimpur Fakir Maula Darbar Sharif. A group of extremists led by Mahbubur Rahman Mithu, General Secretary of Singair Upazila BNP, suddenly attacked the Sadhu Fair on 21 February 2025, injuring 4 Sadhu Sanyasi (4). Instead of arresting the attackers, the police took Rashid Sarkar's wife and family members to the police station.

28 February 2025: In Dinajpur's Ghoraghat Upazila, a shrine was attacked, vandalized, and set on fire during the preparations for the three-day Urs festival called Rahim Shah Baba Bhandari Mazar. This shrine is located at Gucchugram, Singra union. The vandalism and arson took place on the

afternoon of 28 February 2025 after a violent demonstration, armed with sticks, by Sirate Mustakim Parishad (63).

3 March 2025: On the night of 3 March 2025, people under the banner of ‘Tawhidi Janata’ attacked the shrine of Hazrat Shah Newaz Fakir (Langta Pagla) in Kendua, Netrokona. The attack took place during preparations for the 64-year-old Urs festival. The attackers broke the arch, pandals, and lighting (64).

7 March 2025: A clash broke out between the two sides over the ban on music and dancing at the fair on the occasion of the Urs festival of Shibpasha Abdul Hekim Shah Mazar in Ajmiriganj Upazila of Habiganj. It is learned that music was organized at the fair on the occasion of the Urs of Shibpasha Abdul Hekim Shah Shrine. On Friday (March 7), a protest march was taken out by the religious leaders demanding a ban on music (65). Later, they clashed with the shrine committee. Several people were also injured in this.

8 March 2025: A group of miscreants attacked the shrine of Shah Sufi Reza Sarwar Rajaji (RA) located in the Kalni area of Daudpur Union of Rupganj Upazila of Narayanganj district on March 8, 2025. They vandalized, looted, and set the shrine on fire (10). The attackers attacked twice before and took away the donation box. Devotees and local people from different classes and professions formed a human chain to protest the anarchy.

17 March 2025: A group of people in the name of 'Tawhidi Janata' attacked, vandalized, and set a fire to a shrine in Amtoli Upazila of Barguna. On March 16, 2025, after midnight, about 300 people armed with sticks attacked the shrine of Ismail Shah Baba on the side of Battala Road in Amtali Upazila. During this time, they also destroyed the food cooked for the devotees. In addition to removing various furniture from the shrine, the tin roof of the house, and the bricks of the walls, they also looted (27).

15 April 2025: On April 15, 2025, the entire area is still in shock after a father and son were beaten and hacked to death for not going to an arbitration in Fulbaria, Mymensingh. The entire incident was led by the general secretary of the local union BNP and a member of the local Union Parishad (UP). After the murder of the father and son, people were incited to vandalize and set fire to five houses and a shrine of Nurai Pir, including the house of the former chairman of the union parishad and his brother (66).

30 April 2025: The shrine committee and devotees held a press conference to protest the vandalism of the shrine of Shahar Qutub Hazrat Donka Shah (RA) and demanded the reconstruction, renovation, and trial of those involved in the vandalism.

The speakers at the press conference said that thousands of Ashiqan devotees used to come and go to the shrine of Hazrat Donka Shah (RA) for ages, and here prayers were sought for all people. No kind of shirk was done here. However, a malicious group was doing various things to achieve their own benefits. Recently, by inciting some people, they themselves vandalized the shrine. Today, in independent Bangladesh, those who vandalized the shrines of the saints of Allah should be arrested immediately and given exemplary punishment (76).

10 June 2025: The upazila administration has banned loud music and dancing on all tourist houseboats and local boats in Tanguar Haor in Sunamganj. Upazila Executive Officer Abul Hashem confirmed this information on Tuesday (June 10) morning (67).

11 July 2025: In Ranishankail Upazila of Thakurgaon, miscreants dug up and destroyed the three-hundred-year-old and historic Bibi Sakhinar shrine in the dark of night. They broke the concrete casting and made a four-foot deep hole in this ancient shrine. The miscreants committed this incident on the night of July 11, 2025 (26)

5 September 2025: A group of people attacked and vandalized a Khanka Sharif in Paba Upazila of Rajshahi. The incident took place on September 5, 2025 in Panishail Chandrapukur village of Baragachi Union of the upazila. Azizur Rahman Bhandari built the Khanka Sharif on his land next to his house about 15 years ago. There was a three-day event at the Khanka on the occasion of Eid-e-Miladunnabi (PBUH). More than 150 people attacked the Khanka Sharif in the presence of the police. It is learned that a former member of the local Union Parishad (UP) and BNP leader, Golam Mustafa, led the attack. Bangladesh Jamaat-e-Islami workers were also involved (68).

On the same day, a man named Russell Mollah (28) was killed in an attack and vandalism on the Darbar Sharif of Nurul Haque alias Nural Pagla in Goalanda, Rajbari. More than 50 people were injured in the incident. A group of people attacked the Darbar Sharif in stages. They raised the body of Nural Pagla from the grave and burned it, alleging that he was buried in violation of Sharia law. At least 50 people, including policemen, were injured in this attack by a group of people from a previously

announced protest rally of the Upazila Iman-Aqida Raksha Committee. Two police cars and an Upazila Nirbahi Officer (UNO) car were vandalized there (69).

6 September 2025: Advocate Fazlur Rahman, advisor (suspended) to the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) Chairperson, has issued a warning regarding attempts to demolish various shrines. He said, 'I heard it with my own ears, a certain Maulana, I'll say his name, his name is Amir Hamza. He said that if the shrine of Hazrat Shahjalal is demolished, Jamaat or their affiliates will pay 5 crore taka.' He has strongly protested the destructive activities against the shrines.
